Linking and Distribution



- The Orion project for web-based development is using URLs as the mechanism by which to extend its functionality.
- The EMO believes that the use of a URL to link to a publicly available resource on the internet does not constitute distribution.
- We need to reach a consensus that this approach is reasonable, and that it conforms to the existing policies and procedures of the Eclipse Foundation.

WebKit and the LGPL



- We have had several projects at Eclipse collapse because they could not use WebKit (see Blinki)
- WebKit is the *de facto* standard HTML rendering engine (see Safari, Chrome, RIM,...)
- Strawman proposal is to use an approach similar to what we recently implemented for the case where we cannot ascertain provenance to the degree we normally do
 - E.g. Seek specific Board approval

OpenJDK



- Java SE has gone open source under the GPL+CE (GPLv2 plus Classpath exception)
- OpenJDK is now supported by two of Eclipse's largest patrons: Oracle and IBM
- Can we claim support for OpenJDK?
- Can we distribute OpenJDK?
 - Apple Mac Store makes this question particularly interesting
