




















SDK Download Requests – By Package








•Classic download % increases, appears to be partly related to "deep linking" in non-English countries. I.e., China, German language sites tend to link to Classic package download more than others.



SDK By Region By Month






- First glance makes it look like APAC had outrageous growth with Europa.
- Look again! North America spiked 2.3x between June/July and APAC 2.5x. – I.e., consistent global trends.

SDK Download Requests – By Country




- China growth stabilizes
 - 07Q4(20%) 08Q1(18%)
- Rest of world very stable QoQ.

- Compare with Nov'06:
 - Mac 3.1%
 - Linux 9.6%
- Clear, consistent growth of Mac downloads.
- Linux fluxuates between 9.5 and 10.5%, no pattern.
- Reminder Many Linux users do not get Eclipse through eclipse.org but through their distros!




Benefits to Diversity In Membership




- More opportunities for members and projects

 - More Members = More & Better Services




- Protects health of ecosystem

 Better organize AIP Membership and stagger dues based on Revenue.

New Membership Classes created –
 "Corporate Member"

ORGANIZE AIP MEMBERSHIP

Organize AIP Membership

 Certain % of membership are just looking to show support for Eclipse Foundation, but not interested in participating heavily nor looking for significant direct benefits / ROI on membership.

Summary:

- Structure AIP dues based on revenue tiers similar to how many other consortia are organized.
- Catch this "supportive-only" Membership in new "for-profit" Associate membership (\$5k fee).

"For Profit" Associate

• Dues:

- \$0 for organization types approved by the board
 - Media, certain non-profits, government agencies, etc.
- Flat Fee of \$5,000 for all other organizations.

New AIP Member Dues

Effective for new members and renewals on/after January 1, 2009:

Dues based on our understanding of the price sensitivity of membership, survey of other consortia and member driven organizations such as OMG and ability to make a compelling "Associate versus AIP versus Corporate Member" business case.

NEW MEMBERSHIP CLASS Corporate Member

Corporate Member

- Mid-tier Membership between AIP and Strategic.
 - No requirement for committers
 - No requirement for commercial offering
 - Flat fee of \$125,000.

Corporate Member Benefits

- All AIP Member Benefits
 - Includes Board Rep Vote (i.e., does not add more board seats, Ecosystem and Corporate Members share board representation)
- Enhanced Access to IP Review
 - Annual report/meeting on IP Policy and Issues
 - Annual Release Train IP Review Log
 - Leather bound and personally hand delivered by Janet
 - Other benefits as available (TBD)
- Annual Customer Advisory Retreat
 - Link Strategic Developers with Strategic and Corporate Members annually in line w/ June Board meeting
 - Rejuvenate Requirements Council by establishing link between RC and the new larger group of Corporate Consumers
- Other possible benefits TBD
 - Annual Onsite visit from EF staff, Eclipse.org promotion, access to working groups, UD stats, etc.

NEW ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBERSHIP VIEW

For Your Consideration – Renaming

Let's rename "Add-In Provider" to "Member"

- Let's categorize the membership types into three major tiers:
 - Supporting Members (Associates)
 - Sustaining Members (Members "AIP" + Corporate)
 - Strategic Members (SD + SC)

 - Access to Membership Mail Lists and Newsletters

 - Fee Tiered based on Revenue

 - More TBD.

Corporate Membership Benefits

- All Benefits of Corporate Membership Plus:
 - Board Seat and Influence
 - Promotion on Eclipse.org

APPROVAL & TRANSITION PLAN

Approval & Transition Plan

- Approval
 - Board Resolution, April, 2008 Board Meeting:
 - Establish SD Minimum Dues Effective for renewals after April Board Meeting
 - EMO with External counsel to amend membership agreement and bylaws for approval:
 - Board June 2008, Face to Face board meeting.
 - Membership at large As soon as practical after Board Meeting.
- Work to accept Corporate Memberships in mid/late 2008 pending approvals.
- Transition during 2009
 - All AIP renewals on or after January 1, 2009 to renew with new dues structure, option to become Associate.
